**Dangerous Compassion:** Panhandling is a business, plain and simple. The panhandlers you see day after day on the sidewalks, in front of your ministries or by off-ramps, are there because people pay them to be there. They know how to appeal for money. Their signs, messages, and props are market-tested.

Paying panhandlers is *Dangerous Compassion*. It becomes harmful when it enables self-destructive behavior. When someone on the street asks for money, do not look away; acknowledge the person but do not dig into your pocket. Do not give just because someone makes you feel guilty. Do not be pressured or manipulated. Your money will probably not be spent for food, bus tickets, or phone calls home. There are more than thirty places in Portland to get free meals.

You are not a bad person if you refuse to give money that encourages another person to sustain a self-destructive lifestyle. Instead, give your spare change to local organizations that build relationships with guests, and provide support and nurturing that allows them to overcome their addictions and make permanent positive changes in their lives. How do you want your five dollar donation spent? Some local charities can buy 200 pounds of food or snacks for five dollars.
