All cash proceeds will benefit our sister school, Pimpollo Home for Children, in Juchitan, Oaxaca, Mexico. Social Security: On January 1 changes in the Medicare Law may allow more people on Medicare to qualify for assistance with prescription drug costs. Protect Yourself: The Central Precinct of the Portland Police Bureau has seen a spike in car prowls (the unlawful taking of motor vehicle contents or parts) recently. As a part of the Crime Prevention Program continued efforts to reduce crime and improve neighborhood livability, the police suggests there are many steps that you can do to help not become a victim of a car prowler in the future. First and foremost, take preventive measures such as keep your car showroom clean; never leave *anything* in sight (bags, purses, garage door openers, etc.) and carry your registration and insurance card with you.
